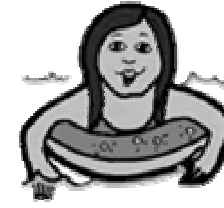
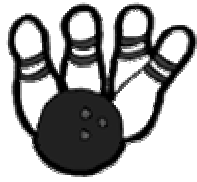


# PARAKIDS SUMMER DAY CAMP INFORMATION

## Registration/Fees

There is a one-time \$30 registration fee. Fees are \$80 weekly and \$30 daily for the first day and \$25 per additional day.

Discounts are available for siblings on weekly fees only. Payments must be made on the first day of attendance each week.

**All payments are non-refundable.**

Registration forms and/or daycamp fees are accepted at any PARA office. PARA accepts CDR and DHR.

## Lunch

Each child should bring a lunch, two snacks and two drinks each day.

## Weekly Activities

All campers will have the opportunity to swim and bowl or skate each week. Each campsite will have their own local field trips such as: movies, parks, CHOM, Public Library, Bryant Museum and Chuck E. Cheese. Each camp will plan their own special events such as sports events, arts/crafts, theme days and more.
