# Message from the Director



Dear Friends,

The year 2021 was the start of the return to normal for parks and recreation. There continued to be spikes, but COVID was waning and people, especially our young ones, were ready to be active again. Youth sports set new highs for participation in basketball and soccer and many other sports like flag football, had high numbers as well. Seniors were also participating in numbers greater than the previous year.

PARA has always been a part of the “experience economy” and in 2021 PARA held 17 softball and baseball tournaments, including the Alabama High School Athletic Association playoffs and the Dixie Youth state championships. This experience left a good impression on the national Dixie Youth officials, as they awarded PARA the 2023 Dixie Youth World Series, a national level event that will bring great exposure for our community and is televised internationally.

Significant new and improved facility projects were completed in 2021. In Sokol Park, Phase One of Mason’s Place all-inclusive playground was completed and an eight-lane obstacle course was built adjacent to the Buddy Powell Pavilion. We are optimistic of hosting an annual obstacle course race at this facility in the upcoming year. A substantial sod and irrigation project was completed at Ol’ Colony Golf. In the area of technology, new financial software was installed and converted to cost center accounting. The new software gives us the ability to utilize data analytics more extensively.

In programming, we re-established a baseball league in West End, something that had disappeared in recent years. Aquatic programming increased as it was realized the aquatic environment was COVID safe. We offered safer, socially distanced programs such as drive-in movies. Due to the pandemic, schools were still functioning at partial capacity. PARA stepped in to provide support for working families through active classrooms and camps that assisted children with distance learning and provided childcare so parents could return to work.

We proved our value to our citizens by keeping facilities and programs clean, open, and operating while other agencies were shut down. I can confidently say that no parks and recreation organization in Alabama served their community as well as Tuscaloosa County Park & Recreation Authority served ours in 2021.

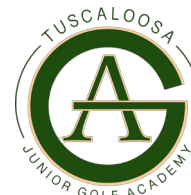
The golf course covers 210 acres of beautiful terrain that surround two lakes and a creek that runs through the property, providing many challenges for the golfer. Ol' Colony is home to the Tuscaloosa Junior Golf Academy, a program that reaches 17,000+ children annually. Our outreach program covers all 31 elementary schools, plus middle and high school golf programs. ## Tuscaloosa Tennis Center



2021 was a terrific year for Tuscaloosa Tennis Center! Our member numbers have continued to increase, our patron list continued to grow, and our tournament registrations were at an all-time high. We hosted 14 UTR (Universal Tennis) tournaments which drew over 1,000 registrants, including two ITA (Intercollegiate Tennis Association) Circuit tournaments, which brought in high level high school and collegiate players from eight states.

We hosted and donated the facility (and staffing) to both the Tuscaloosa Tennis Association and The RISE Center for fundraiser tournaments, which raised more than \$48,000. These funds are put back into tennis through scholarships and play opportunities for youth.

We continue to run programming for several community organizations such as Boys and Girls Clubs, Eagles Wings, and UCP (United Cerebral Palsy). In addition, our Net Generation initiative in the elementary schools started up again after being suspended due to COVID-19, and our hope is to be back in all of the City and County schools in the 2022-2023 school year.

We have been working hard to move to an online court reservation system that will benefit both our members/patrons and make our club more efficient.

Lastly, we are very excited to be moving forward in our plans for club expansion! 2022 and 2023 should be very exciting years for TTC, and we are so grateful for the many members and patrons who have supported us along our collective journeys to enjoy the wonderful benefits tennis provides us.

# Arts Council of Tuscaloosa



The mission of The Arts Council is to promote and encourage the arts and humanities in Tuscaloosa County. The Arts Council serves as the umbrella organization for 50 Member Organizations, offers educational programs, and manages both the historic Bama Theatre and Dinah Washington Cultural Arts Center. Member organizations are local nonprofit arts and cultural groups that contribute to the local community through their programming and educational services.

The Bama Theatre has been a Tuscaloosa feature since 1938 and continues to serve as a venue for film, music, theatre, visual art, and dance. The Council recognizes volunteers, educators, and artists in the biennial Druid Arts Awards, and the Small Grants Program nurtures small and pilot arts activities. The Bama Fanfare, Spectra, and the Poetry Out Loud educational programs serve over 40,000 children annually.

The West Alabama Arts Education Collaborative project serves to offer training for teaching artists in all arts disciplines in using arts integration and the assessment of longevity of skills learned. It also offers training for community arts organizations in arts integration/recruitment of local teaching artists and trains principals on the benefits of becoming an arts integrated school.

Gallery exhibits sponsored by The Arts Council include the West Alabama Juried Show, and the Visual Art Achievement Awards. The Dinah Washington Cultural Arts Center, at 620 Greensboro Ave., includes a black box theatre, The Arts Council Gallery, The University of Alabama Gallery, the Grand Hall, professional catering kitchen, conference room, and office space.

Events sponsored by The Council at the facility include multiple exhibits per year in the gallery, and collaborative events in the Grand Hall.

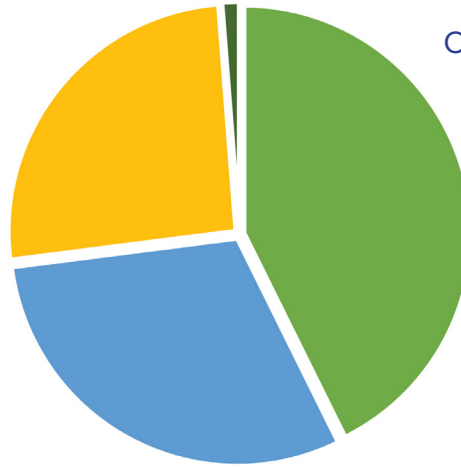

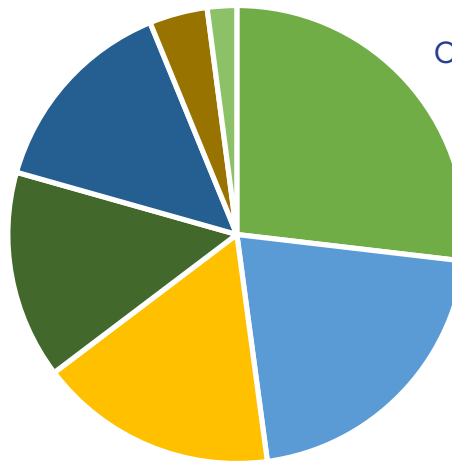
